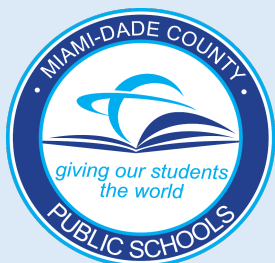

School & Community Background

Located in the city of Hialeah in northwest Miami-Dade, JMMAST transformed in 2011 from a traditional middle-school, which opened in 1987, to a prestigious public STEM magnet academy teaching approximately 1000 students in grades six through twelve. Most of our students come from 1st and 2nd generation immigrant families as Hialeah is a unique, predominantly Hispanic community with over 90% of its residents speaking Spanish at home, an estimated 20% of its residents living below the national poverty line, and a median income of \$53,000 in 2023. While our surrounding community is quite mono-culturally Hispanic, some of our students of varied backgrounds travel from considerable distances either by public transport or family efforts to come to our little gem of academics. Despite these challenges, our students thrive in a rigorous curriculum of Honors, AP, and DE courses so that since 2016, we have been ranked as a Top 100 high-school in the US and most recently a Top 20 magnet school in the US (USNews&WR). Our school offers over 40 extracurricular clubs and honor societies, intramural sports, community events and varied opportunities to foster young students into leaders ready to excel outside our realm.

School Requirements

High school students enrolled at Jose Marti MAST Academy have the opportunity of taking all science courses along with the corresponding lab. Students must satisfy the minimum number of credits in English/Language Arts (4 cr.), Natural Sciences (3 cr.), Mathematics (4 cr.), Social Sciences (3 cr.), and Foreign Languages (2 cr.) in order to graduate. Credits can be earned by taking the appropriate Honors and/or Advanced Placement Courses. Students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative unweighted GPA in these core academic classes if they wish to remain enrolled at JMMAST.

Prior to graduation, students must fulfill their community service component by volunteering for a minimum of 20 hours in a service project. A project proposal must be approved by the Student Services office prior to engaging in their chosen service activity.

All students are given opportunities to participate in a myriad of honor societies, interest clubs, community activities, as well as the eligibility to participate in athletics at their home schools since we do not have a high school athletic program.

Florida Virtual School (FLVS)

Accredited by SACS & AdvancED

Students can enroll in an online FLVS course in lieu of attending class in a traditional classroom environment. They can also obtain extra credits by taking a course in the evening or summer. Students can choose from 100+ different courses.

Dual Enrollment (DE)

Accredited by State Approved Institution (MDC &/or FIU)

Students that pass the Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) are eligible to take college courses at Miami-Dade College. We provide transportation to and from the college for all eligible students. If a student prefers to take courses after school, they can do so at Miami-Dade College or at Florida International University.
